We often hear stories from people who have used CIR products and have had good healing results, but sometimes the most surprising stories come from closest to home.

Two months ago I rang my father. He is 76 years old and lives in Brisbane about 2,000 km away. I asked for news and he told me that for about 8 weeks he had been suffering pain in his wrist from a ganglion. These form when tissues surrounding certain joints become inflamed and swell up with lubricating fluid. He went to the doctor about two weeks previously who lanced the ganglion to drain away the fluid, but after two weeks it had started to swell again and remained painful. He went back to the doctor and was told that it was too soon to lance it and that if it persisted, surgery was the only option, but there was a risk at his age of loss of mobility of the wrist.

My father decided that this was unacceptable and when he got home he strapped his gold personal harmoniser to his wrist. I asked him how long had he strapped it to his wrist and he informed me about 5 hours ago. I then asked if it was painful and he paused and then said "I have just realised that there is no pain at all". Since then 8 weeks have passed, he continued to strap the Personal Harmoniser to his wrist each night and now there is no sign of the ganglion, and he has not suffered any pain since he first strapped the Harmoniser to it. He says that if it hadn't happened to him personally he would never have believed it; the doctor is baffled.

The Minoan Civilisation

In September this year we (Dolly and Jonathan) spent a week's holiday on the Greek Island of Crete. It was a wonderful break for us and we thoroughly enjoyed the sun, sea and local cuisine. The highlight of our stay, however, was connecting with the Minoan Civilisation, the most ancient and advanced in Europe.

The Minoan Civilisation lasted from c.3000 BC to 1100 BC and gave rise to an astonishingly high level of culture, politics, architecture, living, arts and crafts. We visited the Minoan Palace of Knossos, where we were amazed to see the remains and reconstructions of multi-storey palace buildings, with plumbed-in fresh water supply, waste water removal and drainage, bathrooms and washhouses.

Today's high-tech high-rise buildings in earthquake regions of the USA and Japan are built on rubber footings, which give the building elasticity and help to absorb the earthquake vibrations. Well, 4000 years ago, the Minoans used a framework of wooden pillars and beams in their multi-storey construction to achieve the same effect.

The Minoans were a peace-loving and matriarchal society. Minoan women and priestesses played an important and respected part in society. The women wore beautifully tailored dresses showing their bare breasts as fertility symbols. Men and women wore jewellery and painted their finger and toe nails. Their interest and respect for the natural world were

expressed in their frescoes of animals, such as dolphins.

Most interesting for us was their passion for spirals, which feature everywhere on their pottery, jewellery and frescoes. It is believed that the spiral was their symbol of eternal life. Is it possible that the spiral hints at an understanding of subtle energies that is much more profound than ours today?

Viktor Schauberg's maxim was "understand and copy Nature". He wrote about intuition (a female quality) and implosion (a female force). He wrote about the knowledge of the ancients, who had a different understanding of nature and who used different technologies, which have subsequently been lost.

One example of Minoan technology, which suggests an understanding of the subtle

energies and dynamics of water, is the fresh water supply system at Knossos (which incidentally is also mentioned in the German edition of Alexandersson's "Living Water").

Fresh spring water was piped over a distance of 7 km from a hill to the palace, which is a feat in itself. However, the pipe system is pure genius. Conical ceramic segments of approx. 2' length, sealed from the inside with resin and wax, slot into each other to make up the pipe. On the face of it you've got a pipe system, which is water tight, but still allows some "breathing and sweating", keeping the water cool. It is also practical. Leaking segments can be removed and new ones slotted in. However, not so obvious are the clever water dynamics that would have taken place in these pipes, which make them far superior to modern ones. The conical narrowing of one segment followed by the

larger diameter of the next segment would have caused a rapidly alternating speed of flow setting up a rhythmic pulsation in the water. Also this pipe system would have caused a toroidal vortical flow. Toroidal Vortices (eg. Smoke rings) have very stable, self-sustaining dynamics. As such, water flow through these Minoan pipes would have been highly efficient and near frictionless. We can only marvel at the effect the rhythmic pulsation would have had on the water flow. We suspect the dimensions of the pipe segments were quite specific and would have been tuned to enhance the water's toroidal dynamics and quality. There is no doubt in our minds that the Palace of Knossos was thus supplied with highly energised water.

Continuing the Water Egg Saga

Once again we need to apologise to all of you who have been waiting patiently for our Water Egg. Over the last 10 months we have spent a great deal of time, energy and money to get the eggs re-made and at the same time to make suitable improvements. Two attempts by different potteries failed miserably, which left us no alternative but to undertake the remodelling job of the original solid master egg ourselves. The better the finish on this solid egg, the better the finish on the mould and the finished eggs.

perfected the solid egg, complete with a remodelled lid and spout (to enable us to use a different tap).

This solid egg is now with a new pottery. We have seen their work which is of very high quality. It seems, at last we have found the right people to manufacture our eggs. At the time of print, a block mould and silicone rubber case are being made, using latest ceramic technology. By the middle of November we are expecting our first Water Egg. By the end of November we will hopefully receive our first

batch of 100 eggs.
